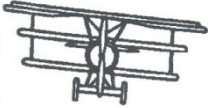

## Bird Field Upkeep

**The Field needs some maintenance. John Holbrook has been in touch with someone that will be supplying us with re-cycled asphalt for our driveway. Gary Likens will spread it out and let it soak up the sun to hopefully become a more permanent solution to our driveway. Here's the dope on "Re-cycled Asphalt"**

" In it's essence, recycled asphalt is just a product of the old asphalt ground into gravel.

The recycled product has much of the original oils still in it and with summer heat the oils and binders are melted into the gravel to make one uniform piece of pavement.

Normally, recycled asphalt is applied cold and compacted and the summer heat softens liquid asphalt in the aggregate and compaction hardens the surface.

If the asphalt company recycles using an automated paver, the material usually stays more uniform and consistent than with manual recycling. Usually, the product is finished and molded using the paver and vibrator roller, making it level and smoother.



A recycled asphalt product gravel driveway is more stable than most other types of gravel and if in the future you would like to have your driveway paved with hot-mix, the recycled product will act as a good base.

Many choose the recycled alternative in order to find a cheaper alternative to conventional hot mix and something more permanent and less dusty than gravel."

## **Besides the Driveway, we need to:**

- 1) Cut down and clear the trees from the gate area
- 2) Clean up the shed
- 3) Replace the broken window in the shed
- 4) Police the grounds
- 5) Repair the pit area fence
- 6) Build new plane stands

## **What has been done so far:**

- 1) Oil has been changed in all the Lawn Mowers.
- 2) All mowers and weed trimmers are running.
- 3) Blades have been sharpened or replaced.
