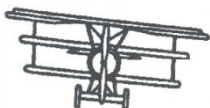

With only 50 members, flying events had models and spectators, many times, numbered in the hundreds. Free flight requires a huge area and in 1949 the field was sold and is now covered in houses and reforestation.
